We're excited to announce the launch of our **PATHWAYS E-learning Course**. This comprehensive program provides methods to integrate Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) and the Whole-School Approach into your classroom.

The course also includes a unique series of mini virtual escape rooms, designed to engage students as they take on the role of sustainability ambassadors. Each game encourages critical thinking and promotes sustainability, with challenges becoming progressively more difficult as students advance.

The course is free and available in English, French, Greek, and Turkish.
